I-TECH has projects in more than 20 countries, and its worldwide staff work in partnership with local ministries of health, universities, non-governmental organizations, medical facilities, and other partners. I-TECH supports development of skilled work forces and overall health systems strengthening with a focus on sustainability and transition to local ownership. The **Instructional Designer (ID)** will apply technical expertise to support workforce development and instructional design for training programs as part of the Integrated Next-Generation Surveillance in Global Health: Translation to Action (INSIGHT) program. The goal of the INSIGHT program is to strengthen global outbreak response, pandemic preparedness, and populations health functions through integrated surveillance systems development across human, animal and environmental health sectors.

This is a consulting position with a negotiated hourly rate. The position is expected to last 6 – 12 months.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Instructional Design & Training Implementation

- Develop, adapt, and review curricula, study guides, training materials and training tools in support of project objectives.
- Plan, manage, and monitor the curriculum development process.
- Work with content experts, subject matter experts and other curriculum developers to assist in the ongoing development & revision of curriculum products.
- Review and edit curricula and other training documents in preparation for dissemination.
- Develop training reports and review data and ensure that this information is used to improve the quality of training content.

REQUIREMENTS

- Experience in instructional design and developing curriculum.
- Excellent writing and editing skills including cross cultural communication skills.

- Demonstrated ability to communicate between colleagues with a variety of cultural backgrounds in a respectful and diplomatic manner.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Training experience.
- Fluency in Spanish or Portuguese.

Equivalent education/experience will substitute for all minimum qualifications except when there are legal requirements, such as a license/certification/registration.
